The January 12 meeting of the R.C.H.S. was held in the Milan Baptist Church. Mr. and Mrs. McIntyre from Versailles were introduced and entertained the group with hymns and songs.

Betty Roepke, President, conducted the business meeting. Everyone introduced themselves. The secretary gave a short report from the fall meeting. Bea Boyd, treasurer, gave a three month report. After all bills had been paid the check book balance was \$452.54.

ModioTheapresident appointed Myron Kelly, Ruth Pickett and Bea Boyd to serve on the nominating committee, to secure nominees for directors from Adams, Brown, Center and Delaware Township. Alan Smith said that he and Herbert Thompson had been looking at materials stored on the second floor of the annex. Both he and Herbert felt there was a need for sorting. President Roepke told them to continue their work of sorting out the things that needed to be catalogued.

Bea Boyd read a letter that Norris Krall had sent with information from Taylor Publishing Co. concerning the publishing of the second history book.

A family photograph may also be included. Be sure appropriate caption identifying people in photo is included, also, be sure your name and address is on the back of photo. These pictures will be returned to you.

PHOTOGRAPHS OF RIPLEY COUNTY: This book will be primarily a record of Ripley County in pictures, please submit any old interesting pictures you may have, for consideration. You may want to have a copy made, even though they will be handled with great care, we cannot guarantee 100 % return. However, we do not know of any pictures lost with the first book.

PUBLICATION DATE AND COST: We are expecting to compile enough material for this book in approximately six months, (August, 1992), and hope for publication within one year. So to insure that you are included in the book, do not delay. The book will have 200 pages with an index, and will have a hard bound cover similar to the first book. The book will be published by Taylor Publishing Company, Dallas, Texas and will be shipped directly to you for \$39.95. There will be no cost to have your material included in the book. HISTORY OF THE MILAN WESLEYAN CHURCH 1934-1990

The Milan Wesleyan Methodist Church became The Milan Wesleyan Church in 1968 following a merger of two denominations.

The Church was formerly the home of the Universalist, built approximately 1882. It was obtained and bought through the last trustees of the Universalist Church.

The Church was organized with the Kentucky Conference under the leadership of Rev. Jacob Hunter, Conference President. Rev. James Zuch was the first pastor. Twelve members joined the church on May 29, 1934. They were: Alice Allen, Carrie Colson, Pearl Enters, William Enters, Fred Hagerty, May Hendrickson, Laura Lewis, Viola Miller, Paul Miller, Eunice Wilson, Ella Zuch, and Rev. James Zuch. With the merger, the church name was changed and it became a part of the Southern Indiana District of the Wesleyan Church. It is now called the Indiana South District.

WHILE YOU'RESPRING CLEANING ----

Have you looked in Grandma's old trunk lately? Give it a try and see if there are some old pictures or articles about early Ripley County that would be of interest to put in Volume 2 of the Ripley County History Book. If you missed getting your family history in the first book this is your chance to be counted. It takes longer than you think, so get started on it. You won't believe how many times you will change and rewrite it! The wheels are turning so it's time to get started. You will be glad you did.

Relationship Chart

A relationship between two people can be determined if a common ancestor is known. The two lineages should both begin with the common ancestor, shown on the chart as number 1. Next, list two lineages, one line shown below as A2, A3, A4, etc., which moves up, and the other as B2, B3, B4, etc., which moves down. By tracing any two persons to a point in the box where the grey or white bands intersect, a legal relationship can be found. For example, A3 and B3 are first cousins, but A3 and B4 are first cousins, once removed.

LEGEND:

N = niece or nephew to uncle or aunt.

GN = Great niece or nephew.

2C 1R = second cousins, once removed.

3C 4R = third cousins, four times removed.
