# ITEMS FROM THE WINTER MEETING

The January meeting of the R.C.H.S. was held on Sunday the <u>13</u>th. We apologize for getting the date wrong last time. We met at the Elrod Community Building with 27 members and quests present.

Pres. Chester Henderson called the meeting to order; everyone introduced themselves by name and township. The secretary's minutes were accepted as read.

Chester appointed the following three ladies to serve on the nominating committee. Katheryn Manship, Alice Glover and Truly Draut. They are to secure directors from the following townships: Laughery, Otter Creek, Shelby and Washington for a three year term. President Henderson had contacted the majority of the directors for their approval for the copier that the directors had been considering buying for several months. Approval was granted.

Bea Boyd gave the treasurer's report and explained that the new copier had been purchased. The monies from the Tyson Fund had been used for this piece of equipment.

Dan Goris was introduced and conducted the program on "The Civil Mr. Goris explained his interest about/the Civil War started in his early childhood. As a youth he lived in Indianapolis and had worked in the Childrens' Museum. Over the years he has collected many Some of which he had on display. He told of Indiana's part in the war. Indiana was always able to reach her quota with The 6th Regiment was made up of men from Ripley Co. and volunteers. the Madison area. The north was very unorganized at the start. did not know the North from the South, as they did not have any standard uniforms. Many hardships were encountered. One person that he mentioned was a man from Dillsboro by the name of Fischer who had died from disease in Memphis, Tenn. Men from Indiana were involved in the Battle of Bull Run, in northeast Virginia. Many men were lost, ending in victory for the Confederates. The only military action which took place in Ripley County during the war came in 1863 when General John H. Morgan led Confederate cavalrymen across the Ohio River from Kentucky through Indiana to Ohio.

Mr. Goris has information he is happy to share with anyone who might be searching for relatives or friends who might have served in the Civil War.

The local paper had an interesting story about the old M.E. Church in 1896. This was the small wooden church which was built during the Civil War. The church was beginning to show its' age and was needing some repairs. One of the stones in the foundation had been removed during some needed repairs and during this time a mother skunk decided it would be a perfect home for her family.

The members were unaware of their uninvited guest until Sunday morning services when the mother, for some reason, became "unhappy" and showed her displeasure in a way skunks will when angered. This unpleasant turn of affairs caused an early exit from the church. The last sentence was "Does anyone know how to get rid of skunk?"

It is unknown how the church solved the problem, as the next few issues of the paper were missing.
