The program will be given by Dan Goris of Versailles based on the Civil War. All people who are interested in the Historical Society and/or the programs are always welcome.

#### NOTES OF THE AUTUMN MEETING

The R.C.H.S. held their fall meeting at the Baptist Church in New Marion, on Sunday afternoon, October 14th. It was a beautiful day. The president, Chester Henderson, called the meeting to order. Twenty-one members and guests answered roll call.

The secretary's report was read with addition added, then accepted. The directors voted to buy the additional Ripley Co. History Books that Norris Krall had informed the society would be available in the near future. Bea Boyd gave the treasurer's report. \$3000 was recieved from the Tyson Fund.

Chester reported to the group that the cistern behind the archives building had been pumped out by the Versailles Fire Departmen and that he and Dr. Glover had filled it with pieces of stone and junk and a truckload of stone.

A get well card was sent to Herbert Thompson, who was in the hospital at Madison. A thanks to Kathleen Lane and her family for doing extra cleaning at the Museum. Kathleen thought more than the usual amount of people toured the Museum during the Pumpkin Show.

Kathryn Manship asked the question; Does anyone have knowledge of a Mrs. Spencer's funeral held in Old Milan, possibly in the home of Governor S. S. Harding. Another question raised was what procedure should be used when 4H children are doing genealogy projects. A motion was made and seconded to charge them 10¢ a copy rather than the 25¢ for the first copy. Motion carried. Another motion was made and seconded to raise the 1992 dues to \$4.00. Motion passed.

The following places were assigned to hold our meetings this coming year: April -- Brown Twp.; July -- Franklin Twp.; October -- Delaware Twp. If this is not agreeable please contact Chester.

The program for the afternoon was given by Geraldine Walker of Milan. She told of her Indian Heritage. She had on display many of her indian articles of clothing, baskets, jewelry, bead work and paintings. Her family went from New York to Oklahoma. Her Grandparents along with her father and mother did much work on Indian Affairs in Washington D. C. She noted that at one time her mother had attended school here in Indiana (White Institute) near Richmond. Both her father and mother were teachers in an Indian Boarding School. She her-

self is very proud to have been a teacher for over forty years. She met and married her husband, Henry Walker, during World War II.

At the close of the meeting refreshments were served by Kathleen Lane and friends.

Seven of the directors met after the regular meeting and decided not to buy earthquake insurance. A thank you note was to be sent to the Versailles Fire Dept. A new copy machine was to be purchased by Bea Boyd with the Tyson grant. It has been done. Our thanks to the Tyson Fund.

#### MEDAL OF HONOR STORY

Some years ago a reporter for the county paper signed their article as "One Present".

As "One Present" I would like to tell you about the Memorial Services that were held at the Holton Cemetery on Sunday, November 11, 1990 at 12:30. This was to place a bronze marker for Jacob H. Overturf, born 1842 commemorating his Congressional Medal of Honor won during the Civil War at the battle of Vicksburg, MS.

This had been made possible through the efforts of Ripley Co. Veterans' Officer, Harold Hopkins, Master of Ceremonies for the event. This was very impressive with Veterans from 4 wars present. Jacob H. Overturf, 90, of Madison, grandson of the Civil War Veteran was honored guest at the dedication, also other W.W.I veterans, Clem Holzer, Osgood; Lafe Nicholson, Dillsboro; Golden Hull and Emil Vanosdol of Holton.

V.F.W. Department Commander, James Leavett was guest speaker. A 21 gun salute was fired and Taps was sounded. Four other Ripley Co. men also received the Medal of Honor during the 8 months seige at Vicksburg, but Overturf was the only one buried in Ripley Co. The four being: Frank Stolz, Sunman, buried at Indianapolis; Joseph Franz, Osgood, Northfield, MN; Rueben Smalley, Poston, South Cemetery, Greensburg; William Steimnetz, Sunman, Cincinnati Weslayan Cemetery. Greensburg honored Smalley Monday, November 12 at 11 A.M. with a marker.

On November 19th we received the news of the death of Jacob Overturf. He is now in his final resting place at the Holton Cemetery, buried next to his father, Henry Clifton Overturf and mother, Jennie Cox Overturf.

And now the rest of the story. Two days after the death of Mr. Overturf, Harold Shelp from Milan walked into Harold Hopkin's office at the Court House wanting the address of Jacob Overturf. In the 1960s he had purchased a box of "what-have-you" at the Maddox auction at Greensburg. Among the articles in the box was a black folder file of the Phoenix Insurance Co. with an 1885 calendar containing: 1.) Appointment of Jacob Overturf to 2nd Sgt., July 28, 1863. 2.) Discharge, September 10, 1864, and Pension Papers of Anna Overturf, October 12, 1916 notification of raise of widows pension to \$20 monthly.

Mr. Shelp had offers to sell but he preferred to give the papers to the Historical Society where they will be framed and placed on display.

## LEST WE FORGET

JOHN RAYMOND STRATTON, 23 years old, Seaman 1st class, U.S. Navy was on the U.S. Battleship Arizona at Pearl Harbor December 7,1941. He was the 1st casualty of World War II from Ripley Co. He was born 23 October 1918, the son of Frank and Amy Edens Stratton of Holton. these contributed by Bea Boyd
