The meeting was adjourned and refreshments by Adams Township were enjoyed. Refreshments next meeting by Center Township since Brown has no director. We need a director from there.



LEVI CEMETERY and the burial of ISAAC LEVI

The Levi Cemetery is located NW Qtr. of Section 22 Twp 8N Range 11E. Martin and Sarah Levi sold their property to Henry Papet 2 Sept 1847 with the exception of ONE SQUARE ROD which was occupied by a burial place of the deceased family Levis. Deed Record Page 103.

Isaac Levi was buried here in 1850 - Through the years the stones were destroyed. Our plans were to put up a stone for Isaac and also a stone designating the Levi Cemetery. A government stone was ordered for Isaac from the Veterans Administration and was delivered March 5, 2001. An estimate was received to do the work. Descendants of the Levi family started a fund (we also applied unsuccessfully for grants). Since we were prevented from placing the stone on the above cemetery, this project has been in limbo. Something needed to be done.

Contact was made with Bill Warren, Trustee of Center Township to see if the stone could be set in the Perservance Cemetery where many of the Levis have been buried. In 2000 this Cemetery had been renovated and recently was enclosed with a white plastic fence. Bill takes very good care of the cemeteries in Center.

The stone was set during the last of October 2005, by Nealis Monument Company. The day I went to see the stone, they were waiting for a burial of a Korean Soldier, a young man was warming up his bugle for the services. The cemetery is located atop a hill, the surrounding view is splendid.



The Perservance Cemetery is on East Fairground Road about one and one-half mile east of the Levi Cemetery.

REOPENING OF THE BUSHING COVERED BRIDGE

On October 28, 2005, the Bushing Bridge was reopened to traffic after being closed most of the year for repairs. The Bushing Bridge was built in 1885, by Thomas Hardman. Although it has been repaired through the years, it received a major renovation during 2005, its 120th year of existence. New concrete footings were poured on each end of the bridge, several structural beams, the steel support rods, the floor joists, the floor, the roof and siding have all been replaced. The stone wall on the east end



was removed, a new foundation was poured and the wall rebuilt. The authentic board and batten siding has been painted red to match the original. The bridge crosses Laughery Creek connecting East Perry Street in Versailles to the Versailles State Park entrance road.




This renovation was done by a private contractor under the supervision of the Ripley County Commissioners and the Ripley County Highway Department.


