

At the close of the meeting Mrs. Lower served refreshments and showed many of her lovely antiques.





CONCLUSION OF THE TOMBSTONE STORY





As we ended the last episode, Uncle Chester Smith's Confederate tombstone was setting on some fence posts in the lot and a Union stone had been ordered. We worried about the first stone; would they want it back?— if so how could we wrap and ship it?

When we returned from visiting some of our kids this spring we found a card from a freight company in Cincinnati -- "Please call us." it said. It was nearly bed time so -- "We'll call them in the morning." The phone woke us at 7 A.M. I think they were worried about getting rid of it. It was delivered later that day and much to our relief, it was a UNION tombstone! Then came a day in May when it was dry enough to wade into the Smith Cemetery (on 200 N, about 1½ miles E of SR 129). Doc Glover and Henry Walker (also related to Chester Smith) combined their talents and set the new stone in time for Memorial Day.

I wonder if the person who made the first tombstone flunked history and if he still had a job.

So finally, mission accomplished: Better 126 years late than not at all.
