### AUTÜMN MEETING

The Ripley County Historical Society will meet at the Archives building on the square in Versailles, Sunday, October 12 at 2:00 o'clock.

#### REPORT OF THE JULY MEETING

The meeting opened with the program presented by Mr. Jim Waechter, directer of the Wayne County Indians Historical Museum at Richmond. He suggested we rotate our items and have them organized to tell a story to make it more interesting for children to learn of our history.

Their museum started in 1855 with a collection of steam engines but is now great in size and variety.

He spoke of various hazards to the artifacts and how to prevent many of them, such as light and how they should be cataloged. Acid free paper, boxes and folders should be used for storage. Don't ever hang silk items, they should be put in a case or box for display. White cotton gloves should be worn when handling most items. Be careful that pictures, paintings, etc. are matted so they don't touch the glass and keep them from direct light. Drapes should be kept drawn as much as possible.

The meeting then opened with each one introducing themself with name and area. Reports were read and accepted. An update on the building fund was made by Norris Krall.

A vote of thanks was given to the Town of Versailles who helped put the rope up on our flagpole. It probably saved some one of us trying to shinny up!

The bank building needs repairs before winter. Also repairs are needed on the old archives buildings water supply. An air conditioner should be put in the museum before next summer.

At the directors meeting it was voted that a key would be given to the Clerks office for their use alone. They must sign in and list what is brought in and out.

Those doing research in the new building where all the data and reference material is now located will be charged \$3 a day for use of the material. appointment is made outside of regular hours the charge is \$5 All our help is volunteer and not always close by. The new archives regular hours are 1 to 4. Copy charges are 25¢ per page for 8x11 and 50¢ for 11x17. Genealogy queries are 50¢ for members and \$1 for nonmembers, payable by check or stamps. Please make them as concise and legible as possible. PLEASE send all correspondence containing money to Mrs. Bea Boyd. Besides being treasurer she keeps mailing lists and memberships. There are still some Ripley County History Book II's available for \$55.

## REPORT FROM THE BUILDING FUND COMMITTEE

In November, 1995, the Ripley County Historical Society (RCHS) appointed a Building Fund Committee to attempt to raise sufficient funds to purchase the Versailles Bank Building located on the Court House Square in Versailles as the repository for their local history and genealogy library. This committee was composed of Scott Smith, chairperson; Julie Underwood; and Norris Krall; all directors of RCHS. This committee began a fund drive to purchase the building and at the same time began negotiations with the owner of the building. In April, 1996, a lease agreement was reached with the owner of the building and an option to purchase the building was included in the agreement. In May, the committee applied for assistance with the fund drive by applying to the State of Indiana for a Neighborhood Assistance Program (NAP) tax credit grant. This tax credit grant was approved in August, 1996, and with the very generous gifts of local citizens along with the benevolence of the Tyson Fund Trustees, RCHS raised sufficient funds to purchase the building on September 30, 1996.

Since that purchase, the Building Fund Committee has continued to raise funds and use them for the repair and restoration of the building. To date they have: replaced the roof on a section of the building; repaired, painted, and sealed the exterior of the building; repaired and replace ceiling tile in the interior; upgraded the lighting on the first floor and in the basement; installed a dehumidifier in the basement to better control the air quality to permit the storage of records; purchased and installed a computer with access to the Internet for researchers; and posted a web page allowing world wide access to the information at RCHS.

Several additional repairs and equipment upgrades are being considered and will be performed as funds are available during the next few months to better protect and make available to the membership and the general public, the excellent historical records preserved by RCHS.

During this time we have received several contributions given in memory of a departed friend or loved one. These contributions have greatly assisted us in our purchase and preservation of this old building. Such contributions may still be made to RCHS and will be used to maintain this facility for the benefit of all interested researchers. All denations will be appropriately and permanently remembered in the records of RCHS.

During the past 18 months since the local history and genealogy library has been located on the square, traffic has increased threefold. Visitors and researchers come from all over the State of Indiana, the U.S., and a few foreign countries. The Library is now opened each weekday afternoon by volunteers from RCHS.

RCHS wishes to again thank all contributors for their support of this project!


