RIPLEY COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY MINUTES By Duane Drockelman, for Secretary Frank Keenan

The spring quarterly meeting was held at the Society's Archives Building on April 10, 2016. The meeting was called to order by President Cheryl Welch at 2:00 p.m. with 20 attendees. After introductions, the President led the Pledge of Allegiance. Duane Drockelman, in absence of Secretary Frank Keenan read the minutes for the January 2016 quarterly meeting. After the correction in the minutes of Counties Newspaper being scanned, it was corrected to the Osgood Journal copies dated 1927-1957, and minutes were then approved. He mentioned that the Society has received the \$4500.00 stepend from the County Auditor's Office. Treasurer, Owen Menchhofer, distributed the treasurer's report and it was approved by attendees. He noted that the Society has received the \$4500.00 Stipend from the County Auditors Office.

President Welch announced that this coming week is the National Volunteer week and the necessity that the Society could use additional Volunteers assistance. She asked that if anyone would like to write an article, such as Connie Kelley's, for the next newsletter, it would be welcomed. Tom Krumm is still having illness issues and is missed for his contributions.

President Welch reported that the Society donated a copy of the "Lest We Forget" book, along with a copy of the "The Dark Line" to the Tyson Library. The Author, Don Morrison donated 4 copies each of "The Dark Line" and "Sugar Branch" to the Society for use.

President Welch also reported that the Society had received a request from the Indiana Sons of the Union Veterans of the Civil War (SUVCW), for any information from all Indiana Counties Historical Societies about the last Civil War Veteran Soldiers Project. This project is for the Indiana Bicentennial/Legacy Project. Duane Drockelman volunteered to do this as he thought his Great-Grandfather, William Drockelman, who died February 18, 1937, was the last GAR soldier in Ripley County. The Bicentennial activities for Ripley County is scheduled for September 17, 2016. President Welch feels that the Society's Archives should be open during the festivities taking place in Versailles on that day. She asked for Volunteers, and possibly have period's clothes for the occasion. More information will be discussed at the July Summer meeting.

Nominations for the following Townships were presented by the committee for approval: Franklin: Fred Glover; Jackson: Delbert Abplanalp; Johnson: Owen Menchoffer, and officially for Bill Gloyds' appointment, Center: Charles Hughes. All were approved at the meeting.

Other business included: Duane will be presenting a talk on Indiana, Ripley County and Adams Twp. History at a public meeting in Sunman at the request of their Bicentennial Committee. Delbert announced that the annual Spring Grove Cemetery tour will be held on Sunday, April 17th, the July meeting speaker scheduled is Josephine Roscoe Keenan discussing her book "In Those First Bright Days of Elvis" The October meeting speaker scheduled is Theresa Carmichael discussing "Stained Glass".

The program was presented by Jim Waldo, representing the Ripley County American Youth Unlimited Organization. He discussed that the organization works with disadvantaged local youth and takes the kids for either a summer or winter excursion to Yellowstone National Park. The organization is 9 years old and takes the kids, along with adult supervision, on a 10-12 days trip. Because of low income, this is sometimes the only trip, of this type, that the kids will have an opportunity to experience. Jim showed photos of these trips with beautiful topagraphy scenes and native animals to that area.

CROSS PLAINS WOMAN'S BOOK TO BE PUBLISHED

Josephine Rascoe Keenan of Cross Plains is excited for the release of her debut book, "In Those First Bright Days of Elvis." The young-adult novel will be released on May 2 by Pen-L Publishing, a small publishing firm based in Arkansas.

Keenan weaves a story of human anguish and betrayal, love and loss, recrimination and regret, and it shows how choices, once made, can change one's life forever. The story is not about Elvis, she told Ripley Publishing, but of a 15-year-old girl in El Dorado, Ark., who attends an amateur rock concert at a football stadium and encounters three strangers: a lookalike, who could pass for her twin; a college boy, who will be the love of her life; and Elvis Presley, just before his meteoric rise to fame. She catches a ride in his pink Cadillac, and sets in motion a series of events that will change her life forever.

I grew up in the '50s and had a wonderful time and I wanted to share it. "America was terrific and in a very good place," Keenan said. She said the setting is her hometown, but it reminds her of Cross Plains, which is partly why she and her husband Frank bought property here several years ago.

While they also have a home in Cincinnati, they have become involved in the local community. Josephine's husband Frank is the secertary of the Ripley County Historical Society and is a director representing Brown Township. For the summer quarterly meeting on Sunday, July 10, the historical society will feature a presentation from Keenan and a book signing.

The book will also be available at the Bookshelf in Batesville, Amazon, Barnes and Noble, online at www.Pen-L.com/InThose First Bright days.html or contact her at fikeenan@fuse.net. It's categorized as young adult, but it's a crossover that would appeal to adults as well, she said.

It took her about five years to write and find a publisher for this book, but it is not the first time she's been published. Her short story "The Petticoat Skipper" was featured in the March 2016 issue of Cricket Magazine and she had another one published in 2007. Three of her plays have been produced in regional theatres. One of them, "Center of the Universe" was chosen as a winner of Ensemble Theatre of Cincinnati's New Play Contest.

The author has worked in theater as a director and professional actor doing plays, TV commercials and featured roles in films. She is currently working on book two in "The Days of Elvis" series.

When Keenan is not writing, she enjoys gardening and country walks, oil painting, square dancing and southern cooking.
