#### RIPLEY COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY MINUTES

The summer quarterly meeting of the Society was held at the RCHS Archives Building on July 14, 2019. The meeting was called to order by President Cheryl Welch at 2:00 P.M. following which she led attendees in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Treasurer Owen Menchhofer distributed his Income and Expenses Reports for the period 1/1/2019 through 3/30/19, which reports were unanimously approved by the members in attendance. Treasurer Menchoffer also noted that Mike Stratton had received a bid for \$4,873.00 for the needed replacement of four (4) of the many Society sponsored Historical markers throughout the County, namely those located at Ballstown; Steamboat Landing; New Marion; and the Napoleon Senior Center.

Society member Bill Gloyd noted that the Osgood Historical Museum is in possession of a watch given to Stephan S. Harding by President Abraham Lincoln!

President Welch noted that the Society's log cabin on the Museum grounds was sorely in need of repairs and that the Society was in the process of getting bids for the repairs. Additionally, the Society will seek a Tyson grant to assist in the cost of the necessary repairs of the cabin.

Members and guests in attendance were reminded of the Taste of Versailles event on the last weekend in July, during which both the Society's Museum and the log cabin would be open to the public between 11:00 to 5:00 p.m.

Attendees were informed that State road crews working on the repair and widening of Route 50 uncovered some fifty unmarked paupers' graves in the State's right-of-way. Society members Helen Einhaus and Mike Stratton are seeking to identify, if possible, these people who are buried in these grave sites.

Author Don Morrison was the featured speaker. Morrison has written three historical books about Switzerland County, Indiana in the 1840s, all of which are a very good read, and are available for sale at the Archives Building. Don additionally discussed his compelling account of the tragic 1868 collision on the Ohio River of two steamboats, "United States" and the "America."

Following the meeting, attendees greatly enjoyed the traditional Ice cream social.

The next meeting will be held October 13. Refreshments will be furnished by the Director at Large.


#### Recent additions to the Ripley County Historical Society


