The Ripley County Historical Society held their quarterly meeting July 9, 2023 at the archives. Twelve members were present.

President Cheryl Welch called the meeting to order and led the attendees in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States of America.

Barbara Eades read the minutes from the last meeting. They were approved as read.

The treasurer's report was presented in paper form. It was approved as presented.

#### Old Business:

- Ripley County History Book Tracy Winters will be sending a copy to the printer this week. It will be 7 10 days before he gets it back.
- If reference to painting the archives, Danny Welch and Duane Drockelman looked under the
  drop ceiling. The tin is not usable. There was a discussion of how to proceed with updating the
  archives. A decision was made to not paint at this time. A possibility of replacing the carpet
  was discussed. A quote will be needed before proceeding. This was tabled until the October
  meeting.
- A discussion was held regarding annual fees, life memberships and research fees for non-members. After a lengthy discussion, Roger Abplanalp moved to increase annual dues to \$20, keep life membership at \$150, and increase non-member research fees to \$10 effective January 1, 2024. Penny Brinson seconded the motion. Motion passed.

#### **New Business:**

- Gary Johnson has filled the vacancy for Washington Township Director.
- The quotes for new steps, concrete landing, and new decking for the museum have been received. A discussion was held on what is best to repair at this time. Duane Drockelman moved to replace the steps and add a concrete landing and apply for the Tyson Grant for this project. Matthew Menchhofer seconded the motion. Motion passed.


Thank you to Penny Brinson for donating a sweeper and microwave to the Historical Society. We will be putting both to good use.

# The Naming of Laughery Creek

Laughery Creek is an 88.6-mile-long (142.6 km) stream that begins in northwestern Ripley County southwest of Napoleon and flows northeast then southeast to Versailles, where it turns east and serves as the boundary between Dearborn and Ohio Counties. Laughery Creek enters the Ohio River 2 miles (3.2 km) south of Aurora, Indiana.

Laughery Creek was named in memory of Lochry's Defeat, a Revolutionary War skirmish that occurred at the mouth of the creek, two miles south of present-day Aurora, Indiana on August 24, 1781. Colonel Archibald Lochry and his Pennsylvania militiamen, were rafting down the Ohio River to join George Rogers Clark in an attack on the British garrison at Fort Detroit. After two days of river travel they sighted and shot an American bison at the mouth of what would come to be called Laughery Creek. While the Pennsylvanians were cooking fresh bison meat for breakfast, they were ambushed by Joseph Brant, a Mohawk military leader allied with the British. Lochry and 40 of his men were killed. The survivors were taken prisoner and marched to forts in Canada. The creek where Lochry was ambushed has been named Laughery for Colonel Lochry. The spelling mistake has been attributed by some to Roosevelt who was an avid historian and owned papers and reports of the battle.

A tale concerning the origin of the name Laughery taken from the Toph Files:

A large band of whites were chasing a small band of Indians during the flood season. The tired Indiana came to a wide and rushing stream. The whites were almost upon them and they cried aloud "La Hoo Ray" which meant "How shall we get across?" The white settlers ever after called the stream in their spelling L-a-u-g-h-e-r-y.
