RIPLEY COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY MINUTES

The Ripley County Historical Society held their quarterly meeting July 13, 2025 at the Ripley County Historical Society Archives. Nineteen members were present.

President Cheryl Welch called the meeting to order and led the attendees in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States of America.

The minutes from the last meeting were read by Secretary Barbara Eades. Owen Menchhofer presented the treasurer's report. The minutes and treasurers' reports were approved.

Old Business:

- Ripley County History Book: We are waiting for Tracy at Winters Publishing to complete the book. Final corrections have been made.
- Our website still has links that do not work. This was brought to the attention of the webmaster.

New Business:

- File Cabinets: Five drawer file cabinets were donated by Kathy Stratton. These will take the place of the four drawer we currently have giving us more storage space for family files.
- The Ripley County Board of Tourism has requested the Ripley County Museum be open one day a month during the remaining of the summer for tours. We will be open the first Wednesday of August, September, and October from 1:00 p.m. – 3:00 p.m.. The museum is open for appointments by calling Cheryl Welch, President 812-621-0418, Duane Drockelman, Vice President 812-852-1313 or Barbara Eades, Secretary 812-701-9238
- Main Street Versailles requested permission to add benches in front of the Archives building.
- We have applied for a Tyson Grant to replace the remaining two windows upstairs in the Archives building.
- Mike Stratton and Owen Menchoffer have replaced nine Ripley County Historical Signs.
- July 26 will be "Taste of Versailles". The Archives will be open for this event.

The meeting was adjourned to the program.

Dan Goris presented a very informative program on Indiana and the Civil War.

Some interesting facts;

The first call was for 12,000 Hoosier volunteers for a 3 month war.

Indiana had over 210,000 join the service.

Over 15% of eligible Hoosiers served.

Indiana soldiers fought 308 battles in 16 states.

Indiana's war related deaths: 25,028 total; 7,243 from battles; 17,785 from disease.

Dan is willing to research any Civil War veteran.

The next meeting will be held at the RCHS Archives October 12, at 2:00 p.m. A follow up program, about the Civil War, will be presented by Dan Goris. Director at Large, Kay Koppel will provide refreshments.

The Ripley County Historical Society is grateful to the Tyson Fund and its Directors for approving our grant request to replace the remaining two windows at the Archive building.

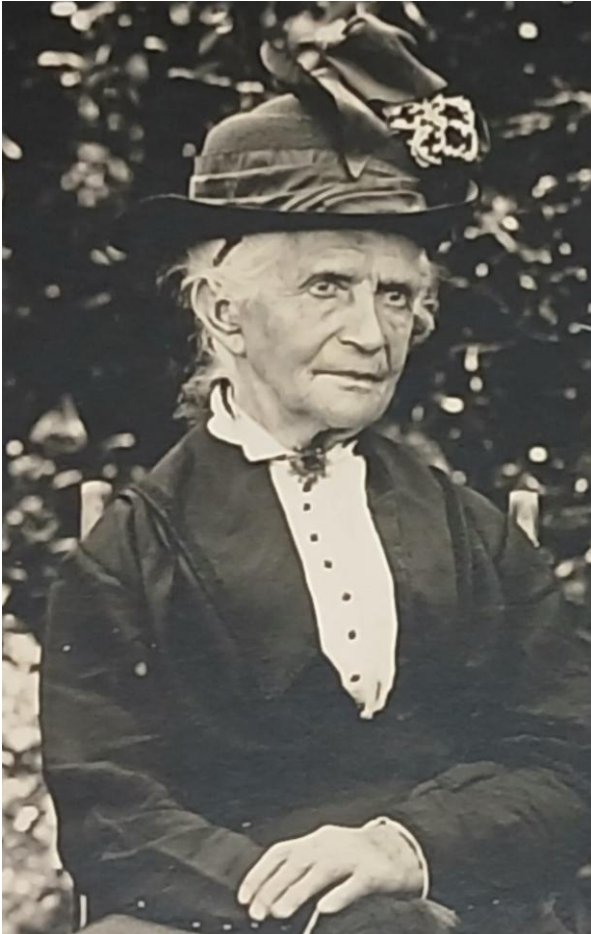

Barbara Fox, Inventor of the Fire Escape

Jacob Fox and his wife and five children emigrated from Brien, Switzerland in 1852. They came to Napoleon and purchased the Gigos property next door to the Railroad House Hotel. Eventually moving to the west edge of Napoleon. One of the children was Miss Barbara Fox (c. 1842-1925). This lady of petite stature invented the fire escape "designed to save lives".

There was a tragic fire in Chicago in 1871. Many were concerned about the many deaths resulting from the fire. This event was the inspiration for her invention. Her design was fabricated by a local blacksmith, Frederick Bredemeyer, who hammered out the escape. She received national recognition for patenting a fire escape

in 1894. On October 12, 1895 she invited people to test it. People came as far as Cincinnati to witness the demonstration. Her apparatus was attached to a window of the fourth story of the 1879 John F. Heimsath Flouring Mill. Several individuals descended to the ground successfully.

Her family was well known for their yodeling, which could be heard in Napoleon from their country home. Barbara was a charter member of St. John's Lutheran Church of Napoleon. She was also a member of the St. John's Ladies Society. She died in 1925. Barbara was laid to rest in an unmarked grave in St. John's cemetery. There is currently an effort to raise funds for a grave marker for her.
